What WE need for this role:

We need you to fill the role of **Young Moms Specialist: Childbirth and Post-Partum Specialist**. This is a **FULL TIME**, **NON-EXEMPT** position. You will wow us by masterfully performing the following key duties and responsibilities:

- Planning and facilitating groups for pregnant and parenting young people onsite and in school-based settings. This includes participant recruitment, space set-up and take-down and group facilitation.
- Providing one-on-one support to clients in the Individual Support Program on topics including but not limited to: financial literacy, finding safe and affordable housing, access to educational opportunities, education on child development and newborn care, and general support with parenting skills.
- Maintaining a client caseload as a Young Moms Specialist.



- Completing program tracking forms, client intake and assessment forms and other agency required documentation and reports as assigned.
- Monitoring and tracking programming outcomes, outputs and other information needed to document agency impact.
- Staying current on trends and best practices related to pregnant or parenting young people.

To be successful in this role, WE'LL need YOU to

- Possess a Bachelor's Degree or equivalent experience of 6 years or more in human service field and/or working with families with young children.
- Have two or more years of caregiving experience with infants, birth to six years or young caregivers.
- Child Birth Educator Certification or agree to obtain certification
- Have demonstrated experience planning, implementing and facilitating groups.
- Have experience working with diverse populations.
- Preferably have lactation experience.
- Demonstrate exceptional interpersonal, communication and relationship building skills.
- Pass all required criminal history background checks.
- Adhere to our Guiding Principles, Mission, Core Competencies and Confidentiality Policy.
- Maintain a valid driver's license and automobile insurance.

How WE'LL make it worth YOUR while

- We will pay you an annual salary between \$38,000-42,000 depending on experience.
- We will pay for your individual health, dental, short/long-term disability and life insurance, if eligible.
- We will give you paid time off that is flexible and meets your needs with our Responsible Time Off Policy.
- We'll pay you for our nine agency holidays and two additional personal holidays to be used at your discretion.
- We will support your mental and emotional health with an Employee Assistance Program as well as a \$300 wellness reimbursement.
